Natural Edge, or Trenching

- Mowers can damage it and it looks bad quickly
- Will heave and requires some maintenance to re-install

Metal Edging

- More expensive
- Lasts longer than plastic
- Disappears in landscape compared to plastic
- Will rust and heave over time requiring some maintenance



Stone Edging

- Nice solid look
- Good option for decorative gravel edge
- Helps direct water when there are drainage issues
- Long lasting
- Most expensive option compared to natural, plastic and steel



Decorative Gravel Barrier Edging

- Good option for drainage issues along bed edge
- Very attractive option
- Long lasting
